

## Ghibli in the Age of Al: Beauty, Belief, and a bit of Controversy

If you have been on the Internet over the last few weeks, you have probably noticed your feed filled with dreamy, animated versions of individuals reimagined as Ghibli characters. The Internet went wild, turning selfies into what they would look like if they lived in the Ghibli universe—all thanks to a viral ChatGPT-assisted trend that combined AI-generated prompts with art tools to capture the iconic Studio Ghibli charm.

Studio Ghibli, the legendary Japanese animation house behind classic movies such as Spirited Away, My Neighbor Totoro, and Princess Mononoke, created some of the most beloved and visually striking worlds. Its distinctive charm comes from a rare mix of handmade looks, storytelling evocativeness, and deep regard for the natural world. In recent years, the classic Ghibli look has sparked a global visual phenomenon—one that is evident in a wide range of formats, from digital imagery and video games to AI-generated visuals and short-form content.

But what makes Ghibli, Ghibli? Founded by directors Hayao Miyazaki and Isao Takahata in 1985, Studio Ghibli was celebrated for its humane storytelling, self-reliant female protagonists, and sublime visual artistry. Unlike the high-action, fast-paced rhythm of many Western animations, Ghibli films like to slow down to enjoy the little things: the pattern of rain against a windowpane, the sound of a kettle boiling, and the whoosh of the blades of grass as one walks by.

The artist's attention to detail has been instrumental in shaping the distinctive look that has become synonymous with "Ghibli art." Some of the distinguishing characteristics of the style include rich, naturalistic backgrounds characterized by painterly texture; muted, warm color palettes that prefer to use pastel tones and earth tones; and soft lighting and moodbased atmosphere that evoke a dreamlike serenity, in combination with whimsical but realistic characters interacting with their worlds in a way that feels both intimate and real.

Historically, Studio Ghibli used hand-drawn animation cells and watercolor background painting,

which is a time-consuming, human-intensive process. Today, artists from every corner of the world are creating the same essence with the help of new technology using personalized brush sets replicating watercolor and gouache effects, color grading LUTs to produce soft, retro-like tones, and AI tools, such as Midjourney or Stable Diffusion, learned on Ghibli-inspired prompts to create intricate fantasy images.

#### What is Miyazaki's view?

If you are asking whether this online tribute has been endorsed by Studio Ghibli, the answer is complex.

Hayao Miyazaki has also been critical of contemporary technology, particularly artificial intelligence. In a widely shared clip from an NHK documentary, he was bluntly critical of an AI-generated animation demonstration, stating, "I strongly feel that this is an insult to life itself." Miyazaki feels that art is a highly human endeavorfirmly based on observation, emotion, and empathy. Animation, to Miyazaki, is not just the movement of images; it is also about capturing the spirit of a moment.

This conflict is inherent in the Ghibli Art Movement. On one hand, worldwide affection for the visual style of Ghibli has resulted in the proliferation of artistic output. However, the application of artificial intelligence to reproduce this style questions originality, authorship, and artistic intent.

The reason why Ghibli resonates today, despite or perhaps because of our increasingly digital lives, is that human beings crave the softness and tranquility that Ghibli-type art provides. In a world dominated by speed, content, and overstimulation, Ghibli is a kind of visual exhale—a return to slow moments, quiet beauty, and magic in the ordinary.

Even branding and UX design are not immune to this trend; designers apply softer typography, hand-drawn icons, and pastel graphics to evoke a Ghibli-like warmth.

Regardless of whether hand-painted, 3D-printed, or even algorithmically generated, the phenomenon of Ghibli's art attests to Studio Ghibli's influence transcending the silver screen. It attests to the timeliness of beauty, the birth of nature, complexity, and emotion.

As artists continue to reimagine this appearance, through traditional techniques as well as computer software, the underlying task remains: to pay homage to the essence of Ghibli, not just in its visual appearance but in its underlying principles. In the director's own words: "Always believe in yourself. Do this and no matter where you are, you will have nothing to fear."

And maybe that's what Ghibli art is really about. Belief. In magic, in beauty, and in the stories we quietly carry with us.

## Generative Al: A New Era of Creativity and Intelligence

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has evolved rapidly over the last decade, and one of its most fascinating branches is Generative AI. This technology is changing the way we create, imagine, and even work From writing essays to designing buildings and making music, Generative AI is making machines more human-like in creativity than ever before. Generative AI refers to a type of artificial intelligence that can generate new content. Unlike traditional AI systems that analyze or classify existing data, generative models can create something entirely new. This could include text, images, music, video, or even code. For example, if you give a generative AI a prompt like "Write a story about a dragon in space," it can generate an original story for you. Similarly, you can ask it to create an image of a futuristic city, and it will produce a realistic or imaginative design.

At the core of most generative AI systems are machine learning models trained on large datasets. One popular type of model used in generative AI is the Generative Adversarial Network (GAN). GANs work through two neural networks — one generates content (the generator), and the other evaluates it (the discriminator). Over time, the generator improves by trying to "fool" the discriminator into thinking its outputs are real. Another widely used model is the Transformer, which powers tools like ChatGPT and Google's Gemini. Transformers work by understanding the relationships between words or data points, allowing them to generate coherent and contextually accurate content. These models are trained on massive amounts of text or data from the internet, books, and more.

Tools like ChatGPT can answer questions, translate languages, or even help with creative writing. Platforms like DALL-E and Midjourney can create digital art from just a text prompt. Al tools can now compose original music in various genres. They can also generate video clips or animate characters with minimal human input. Developers use Al to write and debug code, saving time and improving productivity. It can help create synthetic medical data or design drug molecules. Al is being used to design characters, landscapes, and storylines in games and movies. The biggest advantage of Generative Al is its efficiency. Tasks that once took hours or days — like drafting content or designing visuals — can now be done in minutes. It also promotes accessibility, helping people without professional skills (like non-designers or non-coders) to create high-quality outputs. Additionally, generative tools can serve as creative partners, offering new ideas and perspectives that humans might not consider. Another significant advantage is cost reduction. For businesses, using Al can reduce the need for large creative teams or expensive design software. It also helps with personalization, allowing companies to tailor content for individual users more

easily.

#### Despite all its advantages, Generative AI raises several concerns:

AI-generated content can be used to create fake news, deepfakes, or misleading information. Since AI is trained on existing data, questions arise about whether its output is truly original or whether it borrows too much from human creators. As AI takes over creative and technical roles, some fear it could replace human workers in certain industries. AI models can pick up biases from the data they are trained on, leading to unfair or inappropriate content generation. Training AI on public data sometimes includes information that was not meant to be shared or reused.

As powerful as generative AI is, it's important to use it ethically. Developers, companies, and users must take responsibility for how they use AI-generated content. Transparency is the key — people should know when they are interacting with AI, and creators should credit or disclose AI assistance when applicable. Moreover, while AI can mimic creativity, it doesn't have emotions, values, or human judgment. That's why the human touch is still irreplaceable. AI can suggest, enhance, and inspire — but real creativity often involves empathy, culture, and personal experience that machines can't replicate.

The future of Generative AI is incredibly promising. We can expect more advanced models that can produce even more realistic and context-aware content. AI will likely become more collaborative, not replacing humans but working alongside us. Education, media, healthcare, marketing, and design are just a few sectors that will continue to be transformed by this technology. At the same time, global discussions about AI ethics, regulations, and accountability will shape how far and how fast this technology develops. Striking the right balance between innovation and responsibility will be crucial.

Generative AI is not just a tool; it's a new way of thinking and creating. It gives people the power to turn imagination into reality faster than ever before. Whether you're a writer, artist, engineer, or entrepreneur, generative AI can be a powerful ally. However, with great power comes great responsibility. As we move forward, it's up to all of us to ensure that we use this technology thoughtfully, ethically, and creatively.
