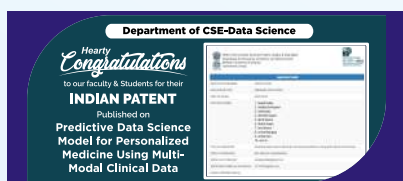
ACHIEVEMENTS SECTION

DEPARTMENT OF MCA

TECHNICAL SECTION

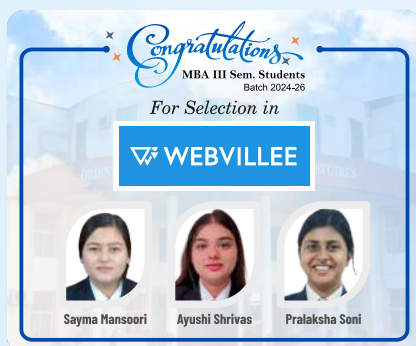

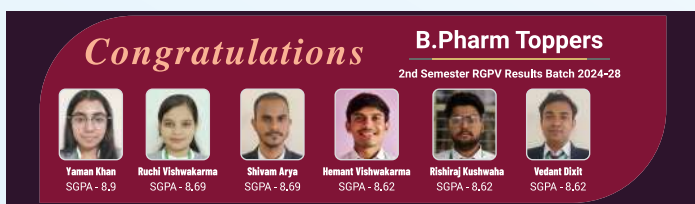

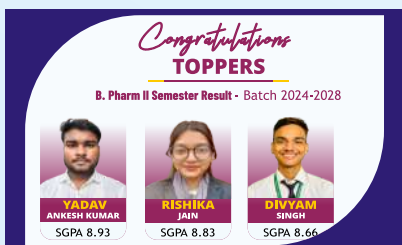
CULTURAL SECTION

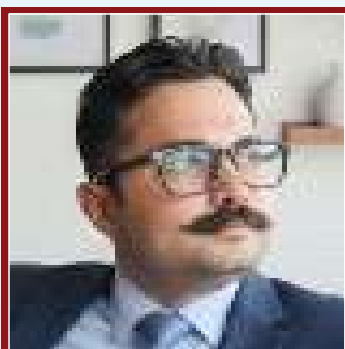

CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION (14th NOVEMBER 2025)

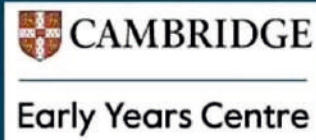
