Economics

Conclusion: Summarize the findings and key learnings from the project.

Bibliography: Mention all sources such as books, websites, newspapers, etc., in a proper format.

Case Study 1: Functions of Money

In a small village, people earlier followed the barter system, where goods were exchanged for goods. However, it created difficulties like lack of double coincidence of wants and absence of a common measure of value.

Later, money was introduced, making transactions easier and more efficient.

Questions: a) Identify any two problems of the barter system mentioned in the case.

b) Explain how money helps in overcoming these problems.

c) State any two functions of money highlighted in the case.

Case Study 2: Role of Central Bank

The central bank of a country observed rising inflation in the economy. To control this, it decided to increase the repo rate and sell government securities in the open market. As a result, the money supply in the economy started decreasing.

Questions: a) Name the policy used by the central bank to control inflation.

b) Explain how an increase in repo rate affects money supply.

c) What is Open Market Operation (OMO)?

d) How do these measures help in controlling inflation?

Business Studies

Research Content: Present the main content with proper headings, subheadings, diagrams, charts, and examples.

Case Studies/Examples: Include real-life business examples or case studies to support your topic.
Conclusion: Summarize key findings, learning outcomes, and overall understanding of the topic.
Bibliography: Mention all references such as textbooks, websites, newspapers, and journals in a proper format.

Case Study 1: Unity of Command & Discipline

d) State any one benefit of following this principle.

Case Study 2: Division of Work & Authority and Responsibility

A manufacturing firm divided its work among different employees based on their specialization. Each employee was given authority to perform tasks, but some employees were not held accountable for their performance, leading to inefficiency.

Questions: a) Identify the principle related to division of tasks among employees.

b) Explain the concept of "Authority and Responsibility."

c) What problem arises when responsibility is not fixed?

d) State one benefit of division of work.

Accountancy

Project on Financial Statement Analysis

What you need to do:

- Select a real company (use financial statements from the internet – annual reports).
- Collect Balance Sheet & Statement of Profit & Loss for at least 2 consecutive years.
- Prepare:
 - Cash Flow Statement Analysis
 - Ratio Analysis (Liquidity, Profitability, Solvency, profitability, activity)- minimum 12 ratios
 - Add proper interpretation and conclusion (very important).

Presentation Guidelines:

- You may use colored pages to make the file attractive, but avoid excessive decoration.
- Keep the focus on clarity, proper formats, and correct calculations.
